Bicycle Parking at District of Columbia Government Properties

Introduction

Over the last ten years, bicycling has become an increasingly popular and efficient mode of transportation in Washington, DC. A succession of city leaders has acknowledged the important role that bicycling can play in relieving congestion, promoting environmental health, encouraging physical activity and generally contributing to a better quality of life for District residents and visitors.

Following the adoption of the DC Bicycle Master Plan in 2005, the city has seen a significant expansion of the bicycle network through the striping of bike lanes, new trail construction, the creation of signed bike routes, as well as extensive bicycle education and encouragement programs. Improvements in the bicycling environment continue to accelerate. In 2008, DC saw the first generation bike sharing system in the United States open for operation. In 2009, new trail construction moved forward along the Red Line in northeast DC, and plans were made for an expansion of the existing bike sharing program. Through a partnership with the Washington Area Bicyclist Association, the city continues to offer bicycle and pedestrian safety classes for DC school children and Confident City Cycling classes for adults.

As more and more people look to the bicycle as a viable transportation option, the importance of having adequate bike parking facilities continues to grow. While current zoning regulations require bike parking equal to 5% of automobile parking at commercial garages, no such requirement applies for office buildings owned or leased by the DC government. Recognizing this shortcoming, the DC Council, which has been historically supportive of efforts to encourage bicycling, and to support a healthy government workforce, passed, in 2008, the “Bicycle Commuter and Parking Expansion Act”. The purpose of the legislation is:

“To provide for the installation of bicycle parking spaces at the John A. Wilson Building to encourage alternate means of transportation and commuting for District employees and visitors, to require the Mayor to publish a study on bicycle parking availability at all buildings occupied by the District government, to require residential buildings to provide bicycle parking spaces, and to increase bicycle parking requirements for office, retail, and service buildings.”

This report, which has been prepared by Alta Planning and Design and the Washington Area Bicyclist Association, is the official response of the District of Columbia Department of Transportation to the Council’s mandate.

Assessment of Demand

As mentioned above, the demand for bicycling facilities has been on the rise and this has been acknowledged in several recent surveys. The recently completed 2007/2008 Household Travel Survey, a study of travel behavior in the DC region conducted by Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, showed that 3.3% of Washington, DC residents commute to work by bike. This is almost seven times the rate of bicycle commuting in the US as a whole. The 2008 American Community Survey, conducted annually by the US Census Bureau, ranked DC 6th in the nation of cities with over 500,000 people for bicycle commuting rates. Additionally, a mode of access study conducted by the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority (WMATA) showed that between 2000 and 2005 the percentage of people accessing Metro rail stations by bicycle increased by over 60%. However, in a 2009 survey of Bike to Work Day participants by the Washington Area Bicyclist Association, 40% of respondents said that bike parking was either non-existent or inadequate at their workplace.

Methodology

The two primary outcomes of this study are an inventory of existing bicycle parking at District owned and leased facilities, and development of recommendations for the number of bike parking spaces that should be provided at each facility. To begin the process, DDOT staff acquired a list of all known owned and leased facilities from the

Office of Property Management. The list included approximately 450 properties, was provided in a database format, and included a map of the properties. The methodology for each stage is outlined below.

The inventory stage of the study included visiting every property and collecting information on existing conditions including number, location and type of any existing bike racks, the number of bikes parked in the racks, the number of bikes parked nearby, not in racks, and the number of vehicle parking spaces. To facilitate the data collection process, a Data Collection Sheet and a Bicycle Rack Key, illustrating different types of bike racks, were developed. Both instruments are included in appendices C and D.

The data was collected during August 2009. The primary data collectors were staff from Alta and WABA, with assistance from interns provided by the District Department of Transportation (DDOT). To ease the data collection effort, a map of each Ward was produced and data was collected on a Ward by Ward basis. Quality control was provided by random checking of selected locations, to verify the accuracy of data collected. Once the data collection sheets were completed, the information for each property was added to the existing data base. This information was then analyzed to determine the recommended number of bike parking spaces for each facility.

Municipalities across the country have developed regulations to determine the amount of bicycle parking that is appropriate for different types of uses, usually based on the number of square feet a specific use occupies. The District of Columbia has been considering changing its current regulations to a system similar to other municipalities based on land use, instead of on the amount of automobile parking. The recommended amounts of bicycle parking used in this report are consistent with the direction being pursued by the District of Columbia and with the best practices from cities around the United States. A table showing existing bike parking and the recommended parking is included at the end of this report (see appendix E). An interactive map showing the locations, with a link to, each facility is being developed. This tool will allow the user to select a location and see the summary of the existing bike parking and the recommended number of new bike parking spaces.

Summary of Findings

There is a severe lack of bicycle parking at District owned facilities. Only a handful of facilities would meet the proposed new bike parking requirements. Also, many of the existing bike racks do not meet the current standards for bicycle racks, leading to a potential for theft and damage to bikes. The following table summarizes the adequacy of the existing bike parking by type of property. Recreation facilities include recreation centers, pools, and other buildings operated by the Parks and Recreation Department. Government Office Buildings are buildings or office spaced that is leased by the District

Government for various functions. Other includes facilities such as Police and Fire Stations, warehouses, transfer stations and shelters.

Based on implementation of the proposed bike parking standards, an estimated total of 11,326 bike parking spaces would need to be added at the 450 locations around the City. Two categories of spaces are included in recommendations. Class A spaces are higher security and are intended for longer term use, such as employee parking. 2802 Class A spaces are included in the estimate. Class B spaces are targeted to short term users and are located near building entrances to provide convenience for users. There are 8526 Class B spaces. For schools, a two phased implementation plan is recommended, where half of the recommended spaces would be installed in the first phase. This strategy is put forward to acknowledge the high cost of implementation for school facilities and that it will likely take a few years until the numbers of students riding to school increases to numbers that will require the recommended amount of bike parking. Class B spaces could be accommodated using the standard inverted U style, or hoop racks, that DDOT currently installs. Using an estimated cost of \$100 per space for the purchase and installation of these spaces, an estimated budget of \$1,326,000 would be needed to install the recommended bike parking. For Elementary and Middle

schools this funding could be provided through the Safe Routes to School program. Funding for the other racks could be provided from a variety of sources.

Existing Policies

The current DC zoning code mandates bicycle parking in all building that have parking for automobiles. The total number of bike parking spaces must be greater than or equal to 5% of automobile parking spaces. The code also stipulates the installation of exterior signage directing cyclists to the garage bike parking (see DC bike parking information in the DC Municipal Regulations excerpted in appendix B of this document). The District Department of Transportation also has specific bike rack style and installation recommendations contained within the “Streetscape Design Guidelines” manual and the “Bicycle Facility Design Guide.”

The federal government recently passed “The Bicycle Commuter Act”, which added bicycle commuting to the list of transportation modes eligible for transportation fringe benefits under the US Tax Code. Under this Act, bicycle commuters are eligible for a \$20 per month pre-tax benefit for costs incurred by bicycle commuting. As of this writing, only one federal agency has implemented the Bicycle Commuter Act and extended transportation fringe benefits to biking or walking commuters. The DC government currently does not offer transportation benefits to its employees.

Model Policies

Many public agencies and quasi-public agencies in the Washington region have policies that not only accommodate the needs of cyclists; they promote and encourage cycling for their employees. The following sections highlight many of these policies. Alta Planning + Design in conjunction with the Washington Area Bicyclist Association and the League of American Bicyclists is currently working with the US General Services Administration on a report reviewing current federal policies regarding bicycling and developing recommendations for increasing bicycle commuting and use by federal employees. Many of the policies highlighted here come from the GSA study. Additionally, the recommendations aspect of the report will be published in the spring of 2010, and many of these recommendations could also be adopted by the District Government.

In-House Bike Sharing

The District Department of Transportation currently has two bicycles with locks and helmets that are free for use by department employees. Using a simple key reservation system, employees can check out bikes for short trips and errands during work hours. The service is provided at no cost to the employee. The State Department recently added a bike sharing program to its Foggy Bottom location. Ten bikes are provided.

The fleet is managed by State Department employees and maintenance is provided by a local bike shop. A similar program is run by the US House of Representatives.

Alternative Transportation Subsidies

In 1987, the Calvert Group of Bethesda established its own Employee Transportation Benefit Program. Starting in 1989, subsidies were added for those that walked to work. Subsidies for bicycle commuters were added in 1993. For walkers, they reimburse the cost of one pair of walking shoes per year, up to \$120. For bicyclists, they reimburse up to \$350 for a bicycle. Calvert believes that its generous and flexible transportation benefit program contributes significantly to its high employee morale, low turnover rate, enhanced recruitment, and improved public image.

Arlington County also provides a subsidy for employees who walk or bike to work at least 14 days a month. The subsidy is \$35 per month and is provided pre tax. The County also allows employees to alternate between the bike/walk subsidy and the transit subsidy, which is up to \$120 a month, so that employees can choose to walk or bike during months with better weather and use transit at other times.

The National Academy of Sciences (NAS) has a very generous bicycle commuting policy. NAS provides employee bike parking at all of its locations and will reimburse employees up to \$120 per month for bicycle related items, such as purchases of bikes or equipment, and maintenance and repair of bikes. Documentation of expenses is required and like Arlington, employees can alternate between the bike benefit and the transit benefit programs. NAS staff estimates that three percent of employees participate in the program.

Model Bike Facilities

The bike facilities at the US Environmental Protection Agency headquarters building on Pennsylvania Avenue NW are likely the most well-appointed facilities for cyclists and runners in the entire metro region. When the EPA was contemplating relocating their headquarters from southwest DC to a facility in the downtown core, EPA bike commuters worked with the General Services Administration to provide secure storage for 100 bikes, along with showers, lockers and changing rooms for cyclists and runners. The bike room even includes a selection of bike maps, a floor pump and tool kit for those that need it. The EPA has been a frequent winner of the Bike to Work Day challenge, fielding the largest number of bike commuters at an agency or company of similar size. Arlington County recently added a secure bike parking cage with 50 spaces in the parking garage at Courthouse Plaza, the primary County office building. In 2008, indoor bike parking spaces were installed in the DC government's Wilson Building.

Workplace Bike Clubs

Both the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Agency (NOAA) have employee bike clubs. These clubs host events for employees who commute by bike, help promote and encourage employees to ride to work, and in the case of NIH, have a program with local retailers that provide bike commuters with biker bucks that can be redeemed at the retailers.

NIH has drawn the highest number of employees and won the Metropolitan Washington Council of Government's award for the area employer with the highest registered BTWD participation the past three years running (2006, 2007 and 2008).



Bike Parking for Visitors

Following the passing of the Bicycle Commuter Expansion Act, the District Department of Transportation began installing inverted U shaped bike racks around the perimeter of the Wilson Building, home of the DC Council and Office of the Mayor. Additional racks for employees were installed within the building itself to provide secure bike storage out of the elements. Arlington County has 52 visitor bike parking spaces at their Courthouse Plaza location. Many of the spaces are under cover and protected from the elements.

One important aspect of the “Bicycle Commuter and Parking Expansion Act” was the call for an implementation schedule by which the city would achieve a ratio of one bike parking space for every ten vehicle spaces. However, current efforts at the Office of Planning to update bike parking requirements in the DC zoning code would change the way bike parking is apportioned from a rate based on the amount of car parking, to one that ties bike parking to the facility type and size. This is important as commensurate efforts are underway to reduce the amount of vehicle parking required at new developments. The chart below gives a numeric list of priority facility types that need to be addressed. Highest priority is number 1, lowest priority is number 24.

Bike Parking at Nationals Stadium

The current bike parking at the new Nationals Stadium is an example for others to follow. During the design process for the stadium, architects were certain to reserve space for a staff valet bike parking area that is enclosed and monitored. The service is made available during all Nationals home games and has proven popular with fans. In addition, ample inverted U bike racks, some featuring the Nationals’ “W” logo, have been installed near all stadium entrances.



Recommendations

Implement Bike Commuter Act at DC Government Agencies

On January 1, 2009, the qualified bicycle commuting reimbursement was added to the list of qualified transportation fringe benefits covered in section 132 (f) of the Internal Revenue Service Code. For the first time, employers are allowed to offer their employees pre-tax subsidies for bicycle commuting. The government of the District of Columbia should make this transportation benefit available to its employees.

Parking Cash Out

DC government employees should also be allowed to cash out parking allowances to pay for transit, or walking and biking benefits.

Adopt Zoning Code Changes to Bike Parking Regulations

The DC Office of Planning is currently in the process of updating the DC zoning code. Parts of the revisions include new recommendations for bike parking at commercial and residential buildings. The bike parking changes proposed by the District Department of Transportation should be fully incorporated into the zoning code.

Provide Bike Commuting Resources to Government Employees

Existing transportation demand management efforts conducted by the District Department of Transportation should place greater emphasis on walking and biking to work. Classes on bicycle commuting should be offered to agency employees, and the DC government should become a more active participant in the regional Bike to Work Day event by issuing a government wide agency bicycle commuter challenge.

Co-Locate New Bike Sharing Stations at Large DC Government Office Buildings

The coming year will see a dramatic expansion of the existing bike sharing system in Washington, DC and around the region. As new station locations are planned, efforts should be made to locate stations near significant DC government buildings like the Reeves Center at 14th and U Streets NW, the Wilson Building on Pennsylvania Avenue NW, government offices at 441 4th Street NW, and Office of Planning Offices in Southwest.

Provide Bike Sharing Memberships to Government Employees

Provide DC Government employees with bike sharing memberships. The expansion of the current system from 100 bikes at 10 kiosks to 1,000 bikes at 100 kiosks will provide an effective alternative for many work-related trips that are currently undertaken in a government vehicle.

Study and Enforce Existing Requirement for Exterior Directional Signage for Garage Bike Parking

Current DC code requires all commercial buildings with attached vehicular parking structures to have bike parking spaces at a rate of 5% of vehicle parking spaces. The code also requires that such buildings have exterior signage directing visitor and employees to the location of the bike parking within the garage. As a follow up to this study it is recommended that an additional study of commercial compliance with the DC code be conducted.



Improve Bike Facility Access to DC Government Buildings

As part of this study, existing and planned bike facilities have been overlaid on a map of DC government offices. While a priority list of bike plan implementation projects to improve safe access to DC government buildings is beyond the scope of this study, the District Department of Transportation should develop a list of priority bike lane or trail projects that will improve access to government employees and visitors.

Expand Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Efforts with DC Government Employees

DC government employees generate a large number of trips per day within the city. Given government-wide efforts to reduce single occupancy motor vehicle trips by expanding transportation options, DC government employees should be courted by transportation demand management efforts now underway within the District Department of Transportation. GoDCGo.com, a partnership between DDOT and local business improvement districts, already provides information on alternative modes of transportation, but should be specifically marketed to DC government employees. In addition, TDM efforts within DDOT should pilot direct marketing of transportation options to employees as well as personal travel planning (PTP) options. New employees in the District government should also be provided with a variety of information on transportation options available to them in an effort to reduce auto-based commute trips.

Appendix A

“The Bicycle Commuter and Parking Expansion Act of 2007”, L17-0103.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Bicycle Commuter and Parking Expansion Act of 2007”.

Sec. 2. Definitions.

For the purposes of this act, the term “bicycle parking space” means a device or enclosure, located within a building or installation, or conveniently adjacent thereto, for securing a bicycle that is easily accessible, clearly visible and so located as to be reasonably secure from theft or vandalism.

Sec. 3. Bicycle parking space requirements.

(a) A bicycle parking space shall conform to the bike parking rack standard established by the District Department of Transportation, or be of such design that will enable the frame to be supported in 2 places, and allow for both wheels of a bicycle to be secured with ease by use of a U-lock, cable lock, or other security device. Exceptions to these standards may be approved by the Mayor.

(b) Bicycle parking spaces installed prior to the effective date of this act that do not meet the requirements of this act shall be permitted until one year after the effective date of this act.

Sec. 4. John A. Wilson Building bicycle parking requirements.

(a) Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, the Council shall increase the number of public bicycle parking spaces at the John A. Wilson Building,

(b) The total number of public bicycle parking spaces provided at the John A. Wilson Building shall be no less than 16; provided, that:

(1) Design, purchase, and installation of the public bicycle parking spaces shall be done in coordination with the District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”) from funds either already allocated to DDOT in fiscal year 2008 or already allocated to the Council in fiscal year 2008 for the maintenance of the John A. Wilson Building;

(2) The design of the bicycle parking spaces shall be consistent with the architectural style and beauty of the John A. Wilson Building; and

(3) At least one bicycle parking space shall be located adjacent to the public entrance on Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., if this is determined to be consistent with historic preservation guidelines and National Park Service regulations.

Sec. 5. Mayor’s report on bicycle parking at District government buildings.

(a) Within 180 days of the effective date of this act, the Mayor shall prepare and make public a report on the availability of bicycle parking spaces at buildings occupied by the District government, including office buildings occupied by District government agencies, public school buildings, public libraries and ranches, recreation centers, and parks.

(b) The report shall include:

(1) The current number of parking spaces available for automobiles;

(2) The current number of parking spaces available for bicycles;

(3) The percentage of available bicycle parking spaces to available automobile parking spaces;

(4) A strategic plan to provide no less than a number of bicycle parking spaces that is equivalent to 10% of the available automobile parking spaces;

(5) A plan for providing a larger number of bicycle parking spaces at locations where it is warranted by current demand;

(6) An evaluation of bicycle travel lanes that lead riders to the facility or park;
And

(7) A detailed report of the bicycle parking plans for the baseball stadium for the Washington Nationals.

Sec. 6. Residential building bicycle parking requirements.

(a)(1) A residential building owner shall provide secure bicycle parking spaces for all existing residential buildings with 8 or more units.

(2)(A) A residential building owner shall provide a reasonable number of bicycle parking spaces for all existing residential buildings within 30 days of one or more residents' written requests, unless an extension due to hardship is granted by the Mayor.

(B) Where complaints of noncompliance have been filed with the Mayor by one or more residents, the Mayor shall facilitate an agreement between the parties and determine the number of bicycle parking spaces that shall be provided.

(C) The bicycle parking spaces shall be provided within 30 days of the Mayor's determination, unless an extension due to hardship is granted by the Mayor.

(3) Where it can be demonstrated that providing bicycle parking spaces required under this subsection is not physically practical, that undue economic hardship would result from strict compliance with the regulation, or that the nature of the building use is such that bicycle parking spaces would not be used, the Mayor may grant, upon written application of the owner of the building, an appropriate exemption or reduced level of compliance. In such cases, a certificate documenting the exemption or reduced level of compliance shall be issued to the building owner.

(b)(1) A residential building owner shall provide at least one secure bicycle parking space for each 3 residential units for all new residential buildings and substantially rehabilitated buildings with 8 or more units.

(2) Where it can be demonstrated in a substantially rehabilitated building that providing bicycle parking spaces is not physically practical, that undue economic hardship would result from strict compliance with the regulation, or that the nature of the building use is such that bicycle parking would not be used, the Mayor may grant, upon written application of the owner of the building, an appropriate exemption or reduced level of compliance. In such cases, a certificate documenting the exemption or reduced level of compliance shall be issued to the building owner.

(3) For the purposes of this subsection, "substantially rehabilitated" means any improvement to or renovation of a residential building for which the improvement or renovation equals or exceeds 50% of the assessed value of the building before the rehabilitation. Existing bicycle parking spaces before rehabilitation shall be considered in calculating the total number of required parking spaces under this subsection.

(c) The Mayor shall identify categories that are eligible for appropriate exemption or reduced level of compliance. The categories include "elderly housing", "assisted living facilities", and "nursing homes" as defined in section 2 of the Health-Care and Community Residence Facility, Hospice and Home Care Licensure Act of 1983, effective February 24, 1984 (D.C. Law 5-48; D.C. Official Code § 44-501).

(d) Any residential buildings that have been exempted from the regulation due to the nature of the use of the building shall provide a minimum number of bicycle parking spaces equal to at least 5% of the number of people employed at the building.

Sec. 7. Increased bicycle parking spaces for office, retail, and service uses.

(a) An owner of a building with office, retail, or service use shall provide a minimum number of bicycle parking spaces at least equal to 5% of the number of automobile parking spaces provided for the building.

(b) If the utilization of the minimum number of bicycle parking spaces is reaching 90% or higher during peak usage periods, the owner of a building with office, retail, or service use shall provide bicycle parking spaces at least equal to 10% of the number of automobile parking spaces provided for the building.

(c) Where it can be demonstrated that providing bicycle parking spaces is not physically practical, that undue economic hardship would result from strict compliance with the regulation, or that the nature of the building use is such that bicycle parking spaces would not be used, the Mayor may grant, upon written application of the owner of the building, an appropriate exemption or reduced level of compliance. In such cases, a certificate documenting the exemption or reduced level of compliance shall be issued to the building owner.

Sec. 8. Rules; Council review.

(a) Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the Mayor, pursuant to Title 1 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*), shall issue rules to implement the provisions of this act.

(b) All rules promulgated under this act shall be submitted to the Council for review and approval.

Sec. 9. Applicability.

Rules promulgated pursuant to this act shall apply to existing, substantially rehabilitated, and new residential, retail, office, and service buildings 6 months after the effective date of this act.

Sec. 10. Zoning regulations.

Nothing in this act shall supplant any requirements of the Zoning Regulations.

Sec. 11. Subject to appropriation.

Section 4 of this act shall be subject to appropriation.

Sec. 12. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 13. Effective date. This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of Congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat.813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

Appendix B

Existing Bicycle Parking Regulations: DC Municipal Regulations, Title 18, Chapter 21

Bicycle parking is required in all buildings with car parking. For advice and assistance on installing bike parking in your building, call the DDOT Bicycle Program at (202) 671-2331.

The following rules come from the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations Title 18, Chapter 21: 2119 BICYCLE PARKING SPACES

2119.1 Bicycle parking spaces shall be provided for office, retail and service uses, except for retail and service uses in the C-3-C¹, C-4², and C-5³ (PAD) districts.

2119.2 The number of bicycle parking spaces provided shall be at least equal to five percent (5%) of the number of automobile parking spaces required under §2101.1.

2119.3 Bicycle facilities shall have convenient access from the building or structure and street or other bicycle right-of-way, be clean, secure and well lit and shall be located within a building or structure, either on the ground floor, basement, or first cellar level.

2119.4 All bicycle parking spaces required under §2119.1 shall be a minimum of two feet (2') in width and six feet (6') in length.

2119.5 An aisle five feet (5') in width shall be provided between rows of bicycle parking spaces and the perimeter of the area devoted to bicycle parking.

2119.6 If a room or common locker not divided into individual spaces is used to meet these requirements, twelve square feet of floor area shall be considered the equivalent of one (1) bicycle parking space. Where manufactured metal lockers or racks are provided, each locker or stall devoted to bicycle parking shall be counted as one bicycle parking space.

2119.7 For office uses in the C-4 and C-5 (PAD) districts, bicycle parking spaces shall be provided as if the building or structure were located in a C-3-C district.

2119.8 Signs shall be posted stating where bicycle parking spaces are located in each building or structure where bicycle parking spaces are required. The signs shall be located in a prominent place at each entrance to the building or structure. The sign shall have a white background, with black lettering which is no more than two inches (2") in height.

2119.9 For a building or structure existing on March 1, 1985, one percent (1%) of the amount of required parking spaces may be converted to bicycle parking spaces of appropriate size.








